

chairman's annual report

nce again it has been a most interesting year in which we have operated. Overall though Tennis has been lucky to have not had the same level of disruption that the Winter codes have suffered as a result of COVID-19.

Initiatives

I would especially like to thank Ryan Forbes, our Chief Executive Officer, for the outstanding contribution he has made to the sport over his two-year tenure, both on and off the court. The amount of work that Ryan put in with the Wilding Park Foundation and the Wilding Park facility, and the tennis on the court has been second to none.

Ryan managed to both organise a sponsor and encourage a top class field to compete in the Canterbury Open, which produced a great event. His drive and vision led to 'Sets in the City', which brought some of the top players from around New Zealand to Wilding Park and also gave the opportunity for some of our top talent to be challenged.

Also the establishment and bedding in of the Pay2Play booking system will enable us to get better information on the participation make up of our sport. To that end I would like to thank the 11 clubs and sub-associations who have taken advantage of better Wilding Park pricing for their members by

providing a database of members. I encourage the remaining clubs and sub-associations to get on board with this initiative.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff at Tennis Canterbury, who do a great job, sometimes under unnecessary duress, and also the board, who have always worked for the best interests of the sport at heart.

The Last Year

Tennis itself has stood up well to the challenges of COVID-19, with slightly increased numbers for the second year in a row. We have had a consistent number of interclub teams over the last two years, which is a very good result. We have been making progress with the Council over shelter at Nga Puna Wai, which hopefully over the next couple of years will show improvement.

I would like to thank the coaches for, as much as anything else, working together to provide the best tennis possible for our younger players. Change is never easy, but in the end we all reach the place we need to be and if this can be done in a cooperative manner all the better.

The Future

The sport itself, like many others, has some challenges. I fully realise that volunteers are not clamouring

to get involved, but I am most disappointed to find ourselves in a position where we are two elected board members down coming into the 2021/2022 season. We must have club involvement at a board level. People with experience and a vision for the future.


We all have our wish list, but we cannot always rely on the public purse to fund our sport, while some seem unwilling to support it themselves. This continues to create financial challenges for Tennis Canterbury. This is reflected in Tennis Canterbury's financial result for the 2020/2021 year, which has been a loss result for the fourth consecutive year. The loss result is down on previous years, but this has largely been achieved through a grant of \$92,000 from the Wilding Park Foundation.

strategic plan 2018-21 reflection

he Tennis Canterbury Region
Inc. strategic plan for the period
2018-2021 identified the following
'Desired Outcomes' for the three
strategic pillars:

Participation

- · Grow the number of players and keep players in the sport
- · Make it easy and enjoyable for players to play tennis.
- · Provide opportunities for players to reach their potential

Performance

- · Canterbury players and teams succeeding at national and international level
- · Provide pathways for players to reach performance and high performance levels
- · People in Canterbury to experience quality tennis
- · Provide pathways for the development of coaches, officials & administrators

Organisation

- · Financially sustainable organisation
- · Provide adequate tennis facilities across the region, incl. RTC and NPW
- · Positive relationship with clubs
- · Implement Club Spark
- · Actively support clubs to adapt to the changing tennis environment

COVID-19 impacted the ability of Tennis Canterbury to make progress towards some of these 'Desired Outcomes'. Across the balance there was mixed levels of success.

The associated 'Success Measures' and assessment of performance against these were:

Participation

1. Increase in membership numbers

Membership numbers reported to Tennis NZ by Tennis Canterbury have decreased by 14 over three years (7,496 in 2021; 7,510 in 2018), noting this includes associations. Excluding the associations from these numbers shows that the membership numbers for Christchurch clubs and the sub-associations have increased by 517 over the past three years (6,404 in 2021; 5,887 in 2018).

2. Establish measures of non-

membership participation

This was intended to be progressed as part of the banded affiliation model, which would encourage clubs and subassociations to report all participants, both members and non-members. The move away from the banded model has impacted progress towards this outcome. The adoption of the Pay2Play database model by 11 clubs and subassociations, which results in sharing of database information, is a start towards being in a position to measure non-member numbers at clubs and sub-associations.

3. Increase in players / spectators at major events

'Sets in the City' was a new major event introduced to the Tennis Canterbury calendar, bringing top national players to Christchurch to compete in an event that also attracted a sponsor. While more spectators at this event would have been desirable, COVID-19 protocols presented challenges.

Performance

1. Success at national teams and individual events

A highlight in 2021 was the Canterbury 17U team winning their National Teams Event. With solid performances from the 12U and 14U teams also, Canterbury finished second overall in 2021. This demonstrates that there are quality players in Canterbury that can compete on the national stage. This is further supported by the individual successes during the three-year period, with six national singles titles and eight national doubles titles won by Canterbury players.

2. Players selected for national honours, teams and development programmes

In the COVID-19 environment with no national honours or teams bestowed on players for the past two years it is not possible to fairly assess success against this measure. However, there were five players in 2021, 12 players in 2020 and 8 players in 2019 that were selected to represent New Zealand in age group and senior events.

Organisation

1. Sustainable annual budget & cash

reserves

The annual budget has projected surpluses for each of the three years, but those projected outcomes have not been achieved. As a result the cash reserves of Tennis Canterbury have declined over the three years, with Accumulated Funds decreasing from \$213,669 in 2018 to \$47,041 in 2021. This remains an area requiring strategic focus moving forward to ensure Tennis Canterbury is sustainable and can deliver services to clubs and sub-associations.

2. Satisfaction measure from clubs

No formal satisfaction measure has been introduced with clubs. Informally it is known that a number of clubs and sub-associations are satisfied with the services provided by Tennis Canterbury, while others have identified areas for improvement and greater collaboration to achieve a desired level of satisfaction.

3. NPW operational and increase in usage of RTC.

Nga Puna Wai is operational, with 12 courts available for use. Land remains available for an additional 12 courts to be developed at Nga Puna Wai in the future. Progression of various improvements, including shelter and wind breaks, will enhance operations at this venue. Enhancements at Wilding Park (the Regional Tennis Centre) have included the creation of nine grass courts. This will support increased usage of Wilding Park in the future. Challenges remain to have usage of Wilding Park at levels consistent with other regional tennis centres throughout the country and this needs to be addressed moving forward to support a sustainable budget and cash reserves.



statement of service performance.

PURPOSE

OBJECTS

The purpose of this statement is to identify the desired service performance to be achieved by Tennis Canterbury Region Inc. in its activities pertaining to its role in promoting and supporting tennis in the Canterbury region.

The Objects of Tennis Canterbury Region are to:

Be the body in the Canterbury and northern South Island region ("the Region") to govern, administer, promote, develop, enhance and protect the sport of tennis mainly as an amateur sport for the recreation and entertainment of the general public in the Region;

Develop opportunities, programmes and facilities to enable, encourage and enhance the participation, enjoyment and performance in tennis in the Region and in Tennis Canterbury Region's activities;

Establish, promote and stage regional and other tennis competitions and events in the Region including determining the rules for such competitions and events;

Seek and promote the membership of Tennis Canterbury Region;

Be the representative of the Members in the Region for Tennis NZ and to liase with other Regional Centres in New Zealand;

Encourage and promote tennis as an activity in the Region that promotes the health and safety of all participants and that respects the principles of fair play and is free from doping;

Give and seek recognition for Members to obtain awards or public recognition for their services to tennis in the Region;

Act in good faith and loyalty with its Members to ensure the maintenance and enhancement of tennis in New Zealand including its standards, quality and its reputation for the collective and mutual benefit of Tennis NZ, Tennis Canterbury Region, the other Regional Centres and its Members;

Seek, maintain and enhance the reputation of tennis th rough the development of rules, standards and practices that fulfil these objects;

Promote mutual trust and confidence among Tennis NZ, Tennis Canterbury Region, the other Regional Centres and its Members and at all times to act on behalf of, and in the interests of, the Members and tennis in New Zealand;

Provide administration and other assistance to Wilding Park Foundation Incorporated;

Undertake and implement the objects of Tennis Canterbury Region in a manner that is consistent with the objects of Tennis NZ and compliant with the Tennis NZ Constitution.



STATUS OF OBJECTS

2015-2020 KEY RESULT AREAS TCRI is currently undertaking activities that are consistent with the stated objects.

The decision of three of the Associations in the Region (Nelson, Marlborough and West Coast) to be autonomous and seek only support as required from Tennis Canterbury Region does mean Tennis Canterbury Region is not ultimately in control of the outcomes being achieved in those geographical areas, but the status quo is considered the most effective option to achieve the stated Objects across the Region.

The current strategic priorities relating to 'Participation', 'Performance' and 'Organisational and Financial Excellence' demonstrate that TCRI is focused on achieving outcomes that are consistent with the overall theme of the Objects.

Participation

- Engage new and retain existing participants, leading to growth in club membership and participant numbers
- Offer quality tennis participation experiences positive and enjoyable

In the past year, services delivered specific to the above strategic outcomes were:

- In 2017 TCRi launched Love Tennis, a tennis promotional weekend for the city and a vehicle for clubs to promote their facilities, their programmes and the sport. vehicle for clubs to promote their facilities, their programmes and the sport. In 2017 19 clubs and 309 volunteers participated. There was continued growth in these numbers in 2020 with 32 Clubs and 497 volunteers participating. Of the 26 Clubs that returned data, 436 visitors were recorded and 128 new members were acquired within those 26 Clubs.
- In 2020 the Tennis Hot Shots in Schools programme provided some 8,000 students from 40 schools (Years 1-8) with a tennis experience. In addition, the Schools Partnership Programme with one large school, which was introduced in 2020, with a purpose to develop a stronger partnership between school, club and coach continued in 2021.
- Almost 1,200 juniors and 800 seniors competed in the 2020/21 Interclub season.
 These numbers were in line with the numbers from the previous season, which is
 pleasing given the expected negative impact on numbers of COVID and the fact that
 the previous season's numbers were well up on prior years.
- Total membership numbers for the Christchurch and Sub Associations region were 6,404 (9% ahead of the previous year). Total Membership of the Association regions, Nelson/Marlborough/West Coast, was 1,567 (23% down on the prior year). The accuracy of casual participation numbers is still developing however 2,162 participants were recorded in the Christchurch and Sub Associations region and 622 were recorded in the Associations regions. Both are well ahead of that recorded in the prior year.

Performance

- Deliver a regional development pathway that supports participants' opportunities to succeed nationally and internationally
- The Player Development Programme provides player development opportunities for a range of players in the area from 10-18 years old. These players are also encouraged to train with their regular coach and in 2020/21 approximately 80 players trained in the programme.
- The TCRI Player Development Programme engages proactively with the Tennis NZ Performance Programme
- Players earned three national singles titles and four doubles titles in 2020/21. Players also reached the finals stages of national tournaments on twenty eight occasions.
- The 17s team won the National Teams event and the 14s and 12s teams placed second and third respectively.
- TCRI facilitated the Canterbury Open and continues to develop this event
- TCRI hosted 4 regional tournaments, 6 schools tournaments, the Canterbury Open and Kiwi Money Tournament, and an ITF J3 tournament. TCRI was also scheduled to host and/or facilitate a number of other events (e.g. including two 12's and 14's National Teams Events and also a South Island Teams Event).
- Five players were selected to represent New Zealand in age group and seniors events.



- TCRI works collaboratively with Tennis NZ, NZTUA, clubs and individual coaches towards participant development
- The Elite Player Pathway Programme (E3P) continued during 2020/21 to provide a holistic development pathway for Canterbury's elite athletes and to bridge the gap between TCRI's Player Development Programmes and Tennis New Zealand's Gold and Silver programmes. The E3P programme includes training and recovery modules including physical conditioning, mental conditioning, nutrition and hydration, physio and yoga elements. Six athletes participated in the programme during the year. An Emerging Elite Programme (2EP) was also established in 2020/21 to bridge the gap between the E3P Programme and the other player development components of development pathway. It is anticipated that a Future Stars Programme (FSP) will be developed in the 2021/22 year to act as a lead in to the 2EP and also as an additional talent ID facilitator.
- An ITF Level 1 Qualification Course, two Coaching Assistant Courses, one junior development coaching course, one hotshots community play course, one cardio tennis and adult coaching workshop, one inclusive tennis workshop (wheel chair, blind tennis, etc) and two Officials courses were held in Christchurch enabling development of local coaches and officials

Organisational and Financial Excellence

- TCRI works collaboratively to deliver valued support and services
- TCRI and its members are financially sustainable
- Organisational processes create informed decision-making and clarity of performance
- TCRI continued to work with the Christchurch City Council, Sport Canterbury and partner sports in relation to the Nga Puna Wai Sports Hub.
- TCRI has provided reports and support support to two community sports hub developments on the east side of the city.
- TCRI has made improvements to Wilding Park to facilitate player engagement and improved competition hosting capabilities.
 Improvements have included a new Gymnasium, a new physio room, a new classroom, two additional meeting rooms, a new high tech Playsight Smartcourt with live streaming capability, a Pay2Play 24hr/7 day facility access system and upgrades to the Wilding Park Kitchen, a new portable coffee/snack caravan contractor, outdoor tables and chairs and the re-establishment of 9 grass courts to the East of the facility.
- Players in the region contributed \$64,000.00 to Tennis NZ (following TNZ's 30% COVID discount) , and for every \$1.00 contributed by members to TCRI, TCRI contributes approximately \$20.00

statement of accounting policies.

BASIS OF PREPARATION

REVENUE

TCRI has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000 for the last two annual reporting periods. This is the second year of its adoption in light of the requirements of the Financial Reporting Act 2013. It previously followed NZ GAAP and the comparative numbers have not been restated. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that TCRI will continue to operate as a going concern in the foreseeable future.

Revenue is accounted for as follows:

Affiliation Income

Affiliation Income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Where members purchase specific services (for example, attendance at the coaching and development course), revenue is initially recorded as revenue in advance, and then recognised proportionally on the basis of the value of each session relative to the total value of the purchased services.

Other fees and subscriptions are recorded as revenue when cash is received.

Fundraising and Grants

Fundraising and Grant income is accounted for depending on whether or not it has a "use or return" condition attached. Where no use or return conditions are attached, the revenue is recorded as income when the cash is received. Where income includes a use or return condition, it is initially recorded as a liability on receipt. The income is then subsequently recognised within the Statement of Financial Performance as the performance conditions are met.

Donations

Donations are accounted for depending on whether they have been provided with a "use or return" condition attached or not. Where no use or return conditions are attached to the donation, revenue is recorded as income when the cash is received. Where donations include a use or return condition, the donation is initially recorded as a liability on receipt. The donation is subsequently recognised within the Statement of Financial Performance as the performance conditions are met.

Donated goods or services (other than donated assets) are not recognised.

Where significant donated assets are received with useful lives of 12 months or more, and the fair value of the asset is readily obtainable, the donation is recorded at the value of the asset obtained. Where the fair value of the asset is not readily obtainable, the donation is not recorded. Donated assets with useful lives less than 12 months are not recorded.

Event Income

Entrance & Participation fees for Representative programmes and events are recorded as revenue when the event takes place.

Interest Income

Interest income is recognised on an accruals basis.



Rental Income

Rental income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Other Income

All other income is accounted for on an accruals basis and accounted for in accordance with the substance of the transaction.

Income Tax

Tennis Canterbury is a registered charity and therefore exempt from income tax

Bank and Cash

Bank and Cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are recorded exclusive of GST, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST.

Debtors

Debtors are carried at estimated realisable value after providing against debts where collection is doubtful.

Finance Leases

Assets under finance leases are recognised as non-current assets in the statement of financial position. Leased assets are recognised initially at the lower of the present value of the minimum lease payments or their fair value. A corresponding liability is established and each lease payment allocated between the liability and interest expense. Leased assets are depreciated on the same basis as equivalent property, plant and equipment.

Inventory

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are shown at cost or valuation less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis on all property, plant and equipment, at rates that will write off the cost of the assets to their estimated residual values over their useful lives. The depreciation rates and useful lives associated with major classes of assets have been estimated as follows:

Buildings 50 years
Furniture and fittings 3 to 25 years
Plant & equipment 3 to 10 years
Indoor court surfaces 25 to 50 years
Outdoor court surfaces 5 to 50 years
Computer hardware 2 to 3 years

Provisions

TCRI recognises a provision for future expenditure of uncertain amount or timing when there is a present obligation (either legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, from which the probability that an outflow of future economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and the ability to determine a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation both exist.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies during the annual reporting period (last year - nil) other than noted above.

Note 9: **Events After the Reporting Date**

On 17 August 2021, following the detection of COVID-19 in the community, the New Zealand Government ordered an economy-wide lockdown, during which all non-essential businesses and organisations would not be permitted to operate. The alert level 4 lockdown, which commenced at 11:59 pm on 17 August, is no longer in effect at the time of signing these financial statements. However, a number of restrictions remain in place which impacts on the ability of Tennis Canterbury to hold some of its revenue generating activities. Further financial support has been obtained from Wilding Park Foundation subsequent to balance date through the provision of further loan facilities. Tennis Canterbury also applied for and received the August 2021 COVID-19 wage subsidy. (Last Year Nil)

Note 10: **Going Concern**

Tennis Canterbury has a negative working capital of 75,764 as at 30 June 2021. The impacts of COVID-19 including government restrictions has impacted on Tennis Canterbury in recent periods. Per note 8, Tennis Canterbury has a loan from Wilding Park Foundation, and as detailed in note 9 further financial support was provided from Wilding Park Foundation subsequent to balance date. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, however Tennis Canterbury remains reliant on the continued support from Wilding Park to remain a going concern.
